# 1. Have you done any future planning for your archives? If so, what kind?

	collaborative repository. We have volunteers working under the guidance of the archivist

to cull our collection, label folders, enter data in Excel, etc.

SCSC We have signed a letter of intent with Heritage and Resource Center (HARC).

OSF-GB We are working with HARC.

SDS-F Categorize what to keep and what not to keep. preliminary research for final place.

CFA Legacy planning; state of the art facilities; cloud-based database

OP-M Currently renovating space at our provincial office in Chicago for our collection. Looking

into hiring a part time paid assistant archivist.

OSB Expansion, renovation, consolidation, reorganization.

SDS-M We are creating a digital catalog (Excel) of each box in our archives and creating new

content labels for each of the boxes. Our archives contain approximately 2400 boxes.

SJ Consistent with inter-province collaboration and as a means of effectively sharing their history, the provinces of Chicago, Detroit, Missouri, and Wisconsin combined their separate

history, the provinces of Chicago, Detroit, Missouri, and Wisconsin combined their separate archives in 1997 in order to establish the Midwest Jesuit Archives in St. Louis. The archives agreed to house the records of the governing body of the Society of Jesus in the United States, the Jesuit Conference, in 2000. In subsequent years, provinces began to reconfigure in the United States and people in leadership positions discussed the possibility of housing additional archival collections in St. Louis. The provincials of the United States met and agreed to centralize their archival materials. We constructed the Jesuit Archives & Research Center (JARC) in 2017-2018 and now house the collective memory of the conference and sixteen past and current administrative provinces of the Society in the

United States.
